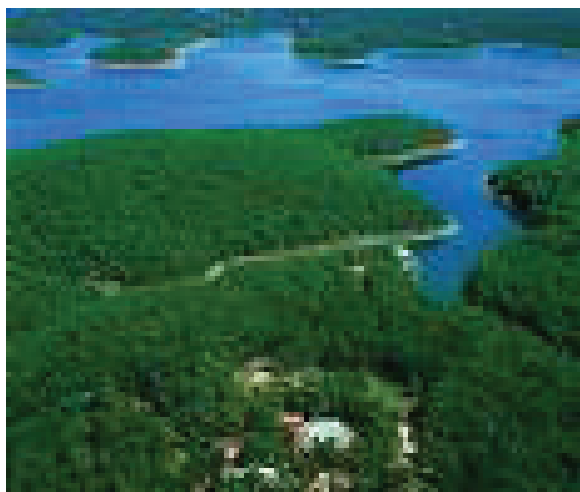




Retire to Mountain Home Arkansas & Traditional Anglican Worship
